Q: ARE THESE PROGRAMS OPEN TO ALL YOUTH? *The programs listed are for in school and out of school youth that live in Baltimore City. There is no cost to the participant but interested young adults **MUST** be committed to completing the enrollment process and attending on a daily basis. The programs are located in different areas of Baltimore City. We define out of school youth as someone 16-21 years of age that is a high school graduate or in need of assistance to obtain their Maryland High School Diploma in a traditional (high school diploma) or non-traditional (GED-General Education Development) learning environment. Each program provides a small, nurturing learning environment with qualified staff to assist with life skills, employability skills, occupational skills training and career development. All of the programs are easily accessible by bus, subway, or light rail. Each program has identified resources for parenting youth to access, that can assist with childcare.*

Q: WILL I RECEIVE A JOB? *Each program is committed to providing each youth with job readiness skills (resume writing, interviewing, communication skills, etc.) that can assist in securing and retaining employment. Only youth that demonstrate job readiness skills will be placed in employment.*
