- Can you approximate the total number of youth to be served by the selected vendors? Is there a targeted number of youth to be served pursuant to each program type? Each vendor will decide upon the number of youth to be served. Cost per youth ranges from \$1,500-\$5,000. Lower level activities to training, with training being more expensive.
- Can State/Federal funds for a licensed group home be a source of leveraged funds? Yes
- Please clarify on page 27 the exact number of program designs offered?
 Pages 11-12 specify only two. There are two primary types of services listed as 1&2 on page 27. Further delineation requests that you specify if you will operate a One Stop Community Center and if your services are year round.
- 4. Can the one stop community youth center be a center other than one certified in accordance with WIA of 1998? Not sure what you mean. We must follow the requirements of the law. What did you have in mind?
- 5. See page 10. Must all subcontracts with MBE/WBEs and other vendors comply with the City's procurement laws? Yes
- 6. Are there suggested MBE/WBE goal requirements for this contract? No, other than those required by the city.
- 7. Since the enactment of WIA 1998 has there been any contract awards similar to this RFP? If yes, who were the awardees? Yes. Current Providers are on our website. Information given out during the bidders conference.
- 8. Must all subcontractors be identified at the time of submitted responses? Yes, if they are contributing leveraged funds and/or program support.
- 9. Can you identify by name the programs that have documented success in achieving WIA Performance measures? Those that are current Providers. Contained in the packets given out during the Bidders conference.
- 10. Of the potential \$2 million in annual contracts is there a predetermined division of funds between the program options? No
- 11. Are there funds available for in-school programming? Yes, the 2 different versions of the bill allow for a certain percentage for in-school programming.
- 12. If you are awarded are start up dollars advanced? Yes
- 13. When will the awards be made? Target award date is March 12-March19, 2004.
